



Partners Ending Homelessness

- **Plans** and **coordinates** the majority of permanent and transitional homeless housing and services in Monroe County
- Oversees the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) which provides a **data-based view** of homelessness in Monroe County
- Oversees Coordinated Entry to ensure that persons with the **highest needs are prioritized** for housing and services

Homelessness has no one stand-alone solution.

Partners Ending Homelessness works across systems and with our stakeholder group, the Homeless Services Network (HSN), which is comprised of **more than 80 organizations and individuals directly involved in providing housing and services** to those experiencing homelessness through **collaboration, teamwork and solidarity.**

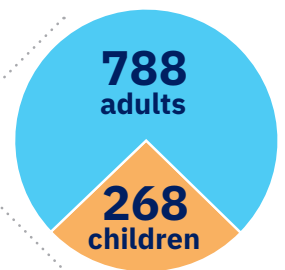
5,000+ people experience homelessness in Monroe County each year.

Stable housing is the foundation upon which **everything** in a person's life is built.

Without a safe, affordable place to live, it is much tougher to maintain good health, get a good education, access employment opportunities, and achieve self-sufficiency.

On any given day, homelessness affects

1056 individuals



122 families

6 unaccompanied minors

181 chronically homeless

325 adults report mental illness and/or substance abuse

101 are adult survivors of domestic violence

These staggering numbers don't reflect the **even greater number** of people experiencing housing instability—those doubled up with friends or family, living in housing with health and safety violations, or paying more than 30% of their monthly income for housing.
