Veterans Stand Down 2022 A Community Service Event for ALL Veterans

The Veterans Stand Down 2022 is billed as a community-wide event to provide assistance to all veterans in need. The priority targeted population remains those veterans who are homeless or at-risk. But it is difficult to expect vets in need to decipher what each participating support organization considers "homeless or at-risk". Even departments within the government have difficulty agreeing on who fits these definitions and other vets, not necessarily homeless, in dire need of various stages of help, should never be turned away. Starting with the first such event in San Diego in 1988, Stand Downs traditionally fit a specific pattern. The VOC. however, has always reserved the privilege to tailor our Stand Downs to meet the typical needs of the Rochester community's veterans based on the VOC's 49 year history, including 22 years operating homeless and atrisk federal programs. As the most experienced independent non-profit community service veterans support organization in the country, we don't want any vet in need to "fall through the cracks" because they don't fit into a category or definition. That philosophy is compatible with the mission of the VOC - "Our mission is to serve veterans with compassion and advocate for all who have worn our nation's uniform so they can RISE and live life to the fullest." We open our doors to any veteran who needs help, and take the opportunity to identify those needs and connect them with the appropriate service providers. Veterans Outreach Center remains anchored in our community and offers a comprehensive portfolio of supportive services designed to meet the needs of veterans and their families. Through the generosity of our community, all of these programs and services are provided free of charge.
